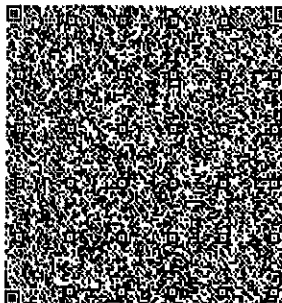

Specifically communicate daily with Cooperators, issue press releases daily, schedule public meetings as needed, and be available in all communities affected by the fire. • Design and implement a method for the immediate transfer of information related to the need for revision of evacuation levels. • Maintain strict financial records, provide fiscal accountability, and ensure all resources are accounted for.

.DISCUSSION...Low afternoon RHs in the mid teens will impact the fire area today and tomorrow, with poor to moderate recoveries overnight. Winds will shift to the west around noon today, then shift to the north in the mid afternoon. Winds will increase from the southwest late in the evening and overnight, becoming less than 10mph mid to late tomorrow morning. Inversion is expected to redevelop by 9PM this evening, then deteriorate around 10AM tomorrow morning.

Sky/weather.....Sunny (0-10 percent). Patchy smoke late in the afternoon.

CWR.....0 percent.

Chance of lightning.0 percent.

Max temperature.....90-93.

Min humidity.....16-21 percent.

Mixing height.....5100 ft AGL.

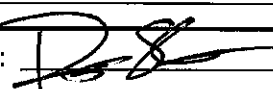

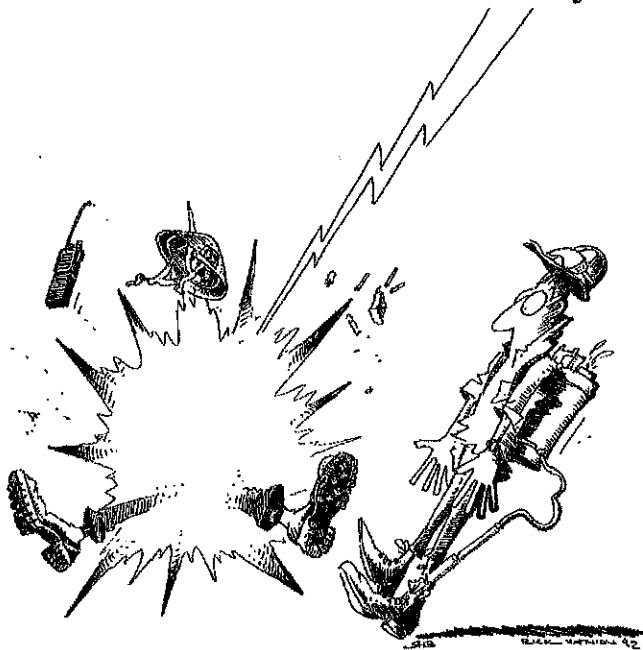
- *Transportation – Fatigue, complacency, increased civilian traffic.

- *Uneven/Steep Terrain- Watch for rolling debris and unstable footing.
- *Snags- Maintain Situational awareness in burned areas for snags and weakened green trees.

Avoid Complacency

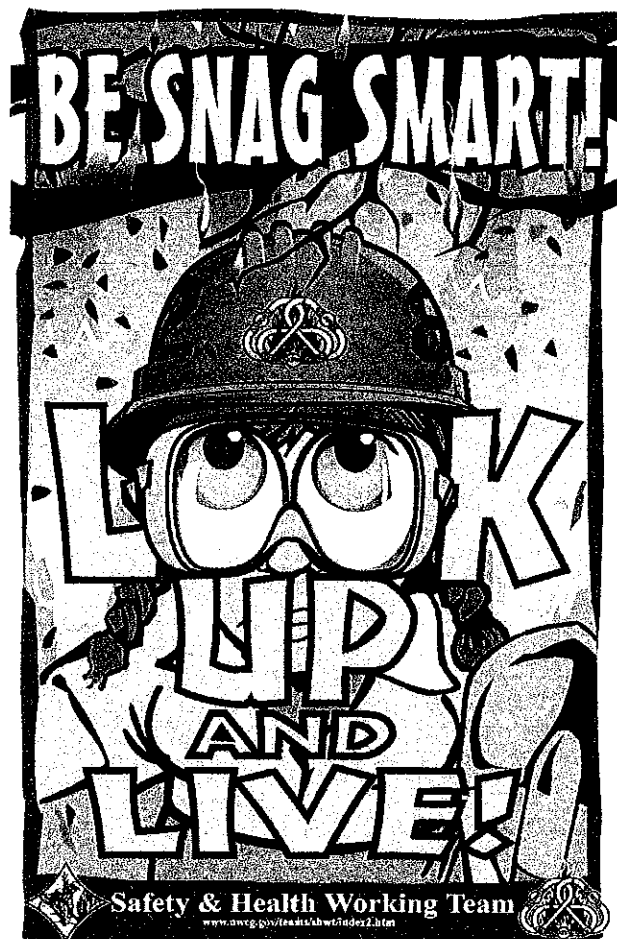
There is much danger in going into “autopilot” when on shift and while driving to and from the fire line. All too often we don’t realize how complacent we are until there is a near miss or close call. Those events tend to jump start our hearts and focus our attention . . . at least for a little while, on the task at hand.

Avoiding complacency requires staying proactive, self-aware, and committed to growth. It means refusing to settle for “good enough” and instead consistently seeking opportunities to improve skills, processes, and performance. One effective approach is setting challenging but achievable goals that push you outside of your comfort zone, ensuring momentum is never lost. Surrounding yourself with people who hold you accountable, welcoming constructive feedback, and regularly reflecting on both successes and shortcomings can help maintain focus and drive. By embracing curiosity, adaptability, and a willingness to learn, you can prevent stagnation and keep moving forward with purpose.
